He was appointed in 2019 to serve on Gov. Brad Little's Idaho Broadband Task Force which developed strategies and proposed policies that have served as the foundation for the expansion of broadband internet to rural Idaho over the last five years. Through Intermax he has continued engaging with rural expansion efforts with the Idaho Broadband Advisory Board as an applicant and recipient of funds earmarked for rural Idaho.
